"BRING THE HEAT" 2019 CHILI COOK-OFF CONTESTANT RULES.

You must read these rules prior to entering.

Entry Information

The contest is open to all private individuals, restaurants, caterers, and foodservice businesses. There are a maximum of 25 slots available. Entries forms and fees must be received by Monday, April 8, 2019. You must be at least 18 years old to enter.

The entry fee is \$25. Each application provides admission for two adult entrants. Additional attendees – including family members – must purchase a ticket for \$15 at the door or \$12 in advance (children 12 and under are free). Advance tickets can be purchased at: http://www.payit2.com/collect-page/98210.

Judging and Prizes

A "blind" tasting will be conducted by a panel of judges who will decide the winners based on appearance, aroma, consistency, taste, and creativity. The decisions of the judging panel will be final. In the event of a tie, a Cook-Off Committee member will cast the deciding vote.

A \$200 grand cash prize will be awarded to the winning individual as determined by the judges. Prizes will also be awarded to second and third place individuals, as well as the top restaurant, based on the judges' scoring.

Prizes will be awarded to the People's Choice individual and restaurant winners, as decided by the tasters who attend the cook-off. Additional non-cash prizes may be awarded for other categories, such as best-decorated station. You will be notified in advance of any additional prize categories.

Cooking

All cooking must be done in a certified kitchen. <u>Individual entrants cooking in a certified kitchen must provide a copy of the license with the entry form.</u> <u>If you do not have access to a certified kitchen, you must cook on site at the Clinton First Aid and Rescue Squad</u>. Tents, cooking grills, tables and a cleaning station will be provided. Bring your own pots and cooking utensils. Hair must be pulled back and covered while chili is being prepared.

Contestants cooking on site should arrive at the Squad no later than 11:00 a.m. on the 13^{th} . Representatives of the Cook-Off Committee will be available to give instructions on set up.

Your Chili

Any type of chili is permitted: meat, vegetarian, with or without beans or pasta. All ingredients and spices are allowed. **Contestants should prepare enough to fill two half-pans of a chafing dish (approx. 3 gallons)**. <u>Having</u> enough chili to last for 2-3 hours of tasting is critical to the success of the cook-off!

At the start of the cook-off, someone from the Committee will ask each contestant to fill an official 8-ounce Judging cup which will be delivered to the judging area at the official time for judging. Your chili should be ready to transfer to your station by 3:30 p.m.

Your Station

Contestants will be given two half-size foil pans over a stand and sternos at tables set up inside the bay of the Rescue Squad. Spoons, napkins and portion cups will be provided. Your table space is about 2 by 3 feet.

<u>Decorations are encouraged!</u> Your station must be manned at all times by no more than 2 adults at one time. Gloves (provided) should be worn when serving chili.

These Rules and Regulations are subject to change at the discretion of the Cook-off Committee.
